

A Proclamation

Whereas Pain is a major public health problem and is the number one reason Americans seek medical care; and

Whereas More than 100 million American adults live with chronic pain as a result of serious illnesses and injuries; and

Whereas One in four adults and among minorities, twice that number suffer from serious chronic pain in Massachusetts; and

Whereas Pain negatively impacts almost every aspect of a person's life including the ability to work, sleep and engage in social activities as well as adversely impacting pain sufferers' families and caregivers; and

Whereas The Institute of Medicine has found that pain costs the United States economy \$560 to \$630 billion per year in medical expenses, lost wages, lost productivity and other associated costs; and

Whereas the Massachusetts Pain Initiative, the U.S. Pain Foundation, the Tufts University School of Medicine's Program on Pain Research, Education and Policy, the American Chronic Pain Association, the Academy of Integrative Pain Management, the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network, the American Society for Pain Management Nursing, the American Society for Pain Management Nursing Eastern Massachusetts Chapter, the National Fibromyalgia and Chronic Pain Association and the American Academy of Pain Medicine, are all working together in Massachusetts to remove the barriers to effective pain care for all Massachusetts citizens and eliminate the under-treatment of pain,

Now, Therefore, I, Charles D. Baker, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim the month of September 2016, to be,

PAIN AWARENESS MONTH

And urge all the citizens of the Commonwealth to take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.
