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In the News

- FDA had a public hearing on standards for future opioid analgesics & incentives to develop pain & addiction therapies. Comment by 11/18
- DEA will cut the prescription opioid supply again totaling 53% over 5 years, while increasing marijuana availability for studies.
- Purdue Pharma filed for bankruptcy due to federal, tribal & state lawsuits related to the opioid crisis, after a \$12 Billion deal was rejected.
- Angels pitcher Tyler Skaggs died from an overdose of fentanyl, oxycodone, oxymorphone & alcohol; may change player drug screening.
- Ethically, all opioid prescribers should know how to taper patients to prevent suffering related to pain and / or withdrawal.
- Opioid overdose deaths declined 11% the first half of 2019 in Massachusetts. Illicit Fentanyl was involved in 92% of those deaths.
- An EPA rule now in effect prohibits facilities from flushing opioids down the drain or toilet, despite FDA & DEA permitting it in homes.
- Last year there was a substantial drop in prescription painkiller misuse, with \$1.8B to fight the opioid crisis this trend can continue.
- Oregon backs off its mandatory opioid taper guidelines, which included an involuntary taper to zero policy. Website has good pain content.
- Dr. Kolodny, longtime critic of opioids discloses how he profits from creating and sustaining a narrative of opioid prescribing dangers.
- Listen to the senate hearing on managing pain in the setting of an opioid crisis. Was the rush to policy change premature? What next?

- Lee P, Le Saux M, Siegel R, et al. <u>Racial and ethnic disparities</u> in the management of acute pain in US emergency departments: Metaanalysis and systematic review. *Am J Emerg Med*. 2019 Sep;37(9):1770-7. Black / Hispanic patients receive less analgesia for acute pain.
- Shover CL, Davis CS, Gordon SC, et al. Association between <u>medical cannabis laws and opioid overdose</u> mortality has reversed over time. *Proc Natl Acad Sci.* 2019;116(26):12624-26. States that have legal marijuana have a 23% increase in opioid-related deaths in recent years.
- Giannitrapani K, Holliday J, Miake-Lye I, et al. <u>Synthesizing the strength of the evidence of complementary and integrative health therapies</u> for pain. Pain Med. 2019 Sept. 20(9): 1831–40. Among CIH methods, acupuncture has the strongest evidence of support with mindfulness, massage & tai chi supported for pain. Well conceptualized table shows the amount and strength of research by pain type, & gaps.
- Dumoulin S, Bouchard S, Ellis J, et al. A randomized controlled trial on the use of <u>virtual reality for needle-related procedures in children</u> and adolescents in the emergency department. *Games Health J*. 2019 Aug;8(4):285-293. VR reduces procedural pain & related fear more than watching TV. Child Life Specialist directed distraction and VR improve patient satisfaction. All 3 distractions cut pain & fear of pain.
- Beehler GP, Murphy JL, King PR, et al. <u>Brief cognitive behavioral therapy for chronic pain</u>: results from a clinical demonstration project in primary care behavioral health. *Clin J Pain*. 2019 Oct;35(10):809-817 Modules teaching goal setting, activity pacing, adaptive thinking & relaxation training were associated with the most significant gains in treatment outcomes (pain & functioning) by the third appointment.
- Donne J, Odrowaz T, Pike S, et al. <u>Teaching palliative care to health professional</u> students: A systematic review and meta-analysis of randomized controlled trials. *Am J Hosp Palliat Care*. 2019 Nov;36(11):1026-41. A 2-hour seminar may be enough to improve students' knowledge & attitudes about palliative care, but additional training time and methods are needed for skill-building activities.

- Cheatle MD, Compton PA, et al. Development of the revised Opioid Risk Tool (ORT) to predict opioid use disorder (OUD) in patients with chronic non-malignant pain. *J Pain*. 2019 Jul;20(7):842-51. <u>Removing the sexual abuse item from the ORT</u> improves identification of risk.
- Noel M, Rosenbloom B, Pavlova M, et al. Remembering the pain of surgery one year later: a longitudinal examination of anxiety in children's pain memory development. *Pain*. 2019 Aug. 160(8): 1729-1739. Negative biases, baseline anxiety, pain anxiety, pain catastrophizing are linked to higher pain scores & exaggerated pain recall contributes to chronic post-surgical pain development in children.
- Liu CW, Bhatia A, et al. Weeding out the problem: the <u>impact of preoperative cannabinoid use on pain</u> in the perioperative period. *Anesth Analg.* 2019 Sep;129(3):874-81. Preoperative cannabinoid is linked to higher pain scores & poorer sleep quality after orthopedic surgery.
- Traeger AC, Lee H, Hübscher M, et al. Effect of intensive patient education vs placebo patient education on outcomes in patients with acute low back pain: a randomized clinical trial. *JAMA Neurol*. 2019 Feb 1;76(2):161-169. Intensive patient education failed to improve acute back pain in patients at high risk of developing chronic pain; above and beyond advice, reassurance & simple, necessary analgesia.
- Schepis TS, McCabe VV, Boyd CJ, et al. The epidemiology of prescription fentanyl misuse in the United States. *Addict Behav.* 2019 Sep;96:89-93. Among subjects in a national study who misused fentanyl, <u>44 times more misused illicit fentanyl than the prescription form</u>.
- Habbouche J, Lee J, Steiger R, et al. Association of hydrocodone schedule change with opioid prescriptions following surgery. JAMA Surg. 2018 Dec 1;153(12):1111-9. Since hydrocodone was rescheduled, patients got more (MME) opioids prescribed after surgery & fewer refills.
- Solomon DH, Shao M, Wolski K, et al. Derivation and validation of a major toxicity risk score among NSAID users based on data from a
 randomized controlled trial. Arthritis Rheumatol. 2019 Aug;71(8):1225-31. A risk tool predicting major NSAID toxicity at 1-year validated.

Complementary Integrative Health

- The pregnancy hormone <u>Relaxin may improve pain & joint mobility</u> for those with arthrofibrosis, such as frozen shoulder syndrome.
- Access to nondrug therapies is limited, but researchers are making a case to expand and pay for nondrug programs to cut opioid use.
- The science behind the <u>benefit of mind/body practices for older adults</u> is reviewed, delineating safe ways to help lower pain.
