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In the News

- FDA says avoid using NSAIDs in pregnancy after 20 weeks because of low amniotic fluid & potential fetal kidney problems
- FDA rejects intravenous Tramadol because its slow onset of action of the first dose, requires another opioid; which can increase risks
- Walmart sues US government for DEA's ineffective handling of the opioid crisis, that is not due their company's filling opioid prescriptions
- Over 1,500 pain patients speak up about obstacles, from cost to mobility issues, that inhibit access to care NIH-recommended pain care
- FDA calls for label changes to all benzodiazepines after an upsurge of poison control center calls and a 9-fold rise overdose deaths.

- Covington E, Argoff C, Ballantyne JC, et al. Ensuring patient protections when tapering opioids: Consensus panel recommendations. *Mayo Clin Proc.* 2020;95(10):2155-2171. New guidelines for opioid tapering emphasize safety, feasibility & harm reduction while controlling pain.
- de Aguiar GPCG, Saraiva MD, Khazaal EJB, et al. Persistent pain and cognitive decline in older adults: a systematic review and meta-analysis from longitudinal studies. *Pain*. 2020 Oct;161(10):2236-47. Cognitive decline in elders with chronic pain vary with pain intensity.
- Cheesman Q, DeFrance M, et al. The effect of preoperative education on opioid consumption in patients undergoing arthroscopic rotator cuff repair. J Shoulder Elbow Surg. 2020 Sep29:1743-50. Opioid education reduces opioid requirement for 2 years after shoulder surgery.
- Fasolino A, Di Stefano G, Leone C, et al. Small-fibre pathology has no impact on somatosensory system function in patients with fibromyalgia. *Pain*. 2020 Oct;161(10):2385-2393. Skin biopsies reveal 30% (not 75%) of fibromyalgia patients have small-fiber pathology.
- Duensing K, Twillman R, et al. An examination of State and Federal opioid analgesic and continuing education policies: 2016–2018. *J Pain Res.* 2020 Oct. (13):2431-42. In 2-years 527 federal & state opioid-related laws were passed with 170 imposing limits on prescribers.
- Voon P, Wang L, Nosova E, et al. Greater pain severity is associated with inability to access addiction treatment among a cohort of people who use drugs. *J Pain Res* 2020 Oct(13): 2443-49. The <u>severity of pain among those with illicit drug use</u> impedes access to OUD treatment
- Darnall BD, Mackey SC, Lorig K, et al. Comparative effectiveness of cognitive behavioral therapy for chronic pain and chronic pain self-management within the context of voluntary patient-centered prescription opioid tapering. *Pain Med.* 2020 Aug 21(8):1523-31. The EMPOWER study demonstrates a method to help patients undergoing voluntary opioid tapering improve biopsychosocial outcomes.
- Armstrong AD, et al. Risk factors for increased postoperative pain and recommended order set for postoperative analgesic usage. Clin J Pain. 2020 Nov;36(11):845-851. Anxiety, current smoking, psychological conditions, & current opioid use raise the risk of post-op pain.
- Burns JW, Janssen I, Lillis T, et al. The transition from <u>acute to persistent pain: the identification of distinct trajectories among women presenting to an emergency department</u>. *Pain*. 2020 Nov;161(11):2511-19. Women with high levels of PTSD symptoms, anger, sleep disturbance & low social support are more vulnerable to have continuing pain 3 months after the index ED visit for that condition.
- de Jesus FLA, et al. Addition of specific hip strengthening exercises to conventional rehabilitation therapy for low back pain: a systematic
 review and meta-analysis. Clin Rehabil. 2020 Nov;34(11):1368-77. Adding hip strengthening exercises to PT can cut back pain & disability

- Oliveira J E Silva L, Lee JY, et al. Intranasal (IN) ketamine for acute pain management in children: A systematic review and meta-analysis. Am J Emerg Med. 2020 Jun 1;38(9):1860-66. IN ketamine vs IN fentanyl have a similar safety & effectiveness profile for children in the ED.
- Karos K, McParland JL, Bunzli S, et al. The social <u>threats of COVID-19 for people with chronic pain</u>. *Pain*. 2020 Oct;161(10):2229-2235. The negative impact of social changes prompted by the pandemic has worsened social distress & access to care for those with chronic pain.
- Naegle MA, Finnell DS, Kaplan L, et al. Opioid crisis through the lens of social justice. *Nurs Outlook*. 2020 Sep-Oct;68(5):678-681. Patients with either pain or opioid use disorders have encountered more disparities during the opioid crisis that interfere with access to care.
- Nalamachu S, Gudin J. Characteristics of <u>analgesic patch formulations</u>. J Pain Res. 2020:13 2343–54. Topical/ transdermal analgesic patch systems are an effective option for treating different pains. Nice review of advantaged & potential problems of the different systems & drugs.
- Keaveney A, Peters E, Way B. Effects of acetaminophen on risk taking. Soc Cogn Affect Neurosci. 2020 Sep 24;15(7):725-732. Among the
 most-used drugs in America, Acetaminophen can facilitate risk-taking behavior which may result from the anxiety reducing effect of the drug
- Owiredua C, Flink I, Vixner L, et al. The context matters: A retrospective analysis of life stage at chronic pain onset in relation to pain characteristics and psychosocial outcomes. J Pain Res 2020 Oct (13): 2685—95. Chronic pain before age 30 is linked to worse outcomes.

- Videos to help professionals talk effectively about opioid use for chronic pain management.
- FDA's "Remove the Risk" resources provides guidance on safe use, secure storage and proper disposal of opioids in the home.
- Race and ethnicity disparities in pain treatments are glaringly evident. We need to recognize and address implicit bias for equity.
- Chronic overlapping pain conditions & chronic non-pain disorders may have overlapping biopsychosocial features, including stress.

Complementary Integrative Health

- <u>Listening to a music app reduced pain & anxiety</u> in the emergency department observation unit; especially for catastrophizing patients.
- Hypnosis, cognitive therapy, hypnotic cognitive therapy & education produce similar symptom reductions for chronic pain lasting a year.
- Black sesame extract oil, relieves acute musculoskeletal pain as quickly as acetaminophen & improves sense of well-being.
- Extracorporeal shock wave therapy for neck/back pain or hip pain cuts pain for longer than standard physiotherapy or sham treatment.
- Slow breathing combined with focused attention on breath reduces pain and its unpleasantness independent of endogenous opioids
