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In the News

- FDA and WHO weigh in on controversy that NSAID use for fever/pain during the COVID-19 pandemic should be a second line choice.
- Opioid company pays Practice Fusion to design its EHR software that prompts opioid prescribing. Favoring their products.
- FDA approved Advil Dual Action (125mg Ibuprofen plus 250mg acetaminophen) for over-the-counter (OTC) sales.
- People harmed by improper (Purdue) opioid prescriptions can file claims against bankrupt Purdue Pharma by June 30th 2020.
- Injectable IV meloxicam (FDA approved) is given daily to treat moderate to severe pain for lower opioid use with less NSAID side effects.
- National Take Back Day is April 25th for safe, convenient & responsible dispose of unused/ or expired prescription drugs.
- Hospira issued a voluntary U.S. recall of ketorolac due to potential particulates that may produce microemboli.
- In 2018, drug overdose deaths were over 4% lower, with prescription opioid deaths down 14% & illicit fentanyl fatalities up 10% from 2017.
- Legislators extends the bill that keeps leading opioid overdose drugs, fentanyl analogues, classified as a Schedule I drug.
- Experts discuss pain & symptom management during COVID-19 pandemic, including the vulnerabilities and care of patients taking opioids.

Analyzing and benchmarking global consumption statistics for opioid analgesics 2015: inequality continues to increase. *J Pain Palliat Care Pharmacother*. 2020 Mar;34(1):1-12. The 20 most-developed countries use of 256mg morphine per capita was 33 times higher than developing nations. The <u>U.S. has 4th most opioid consumption rate behind Germany, Austria & Canada</u>.
- Boland EG, Bennett MI, Allgar V, et al. Cannabinoids for adult cancer-related pain: systematic review and meta-analysis. *BMJ Support Palliat Care*. 2020 Mar;10(1):14-24. Meta-analysis shows for cancer pain, adjunctive cannabinoids don't cut pain, but adds side effects.
- Xu YJ, Sun X, et al. Randomized clinical trial of continuous transversus abdominis plane block, epidural or patient-controlled analgesia for patients undergoing laparoscopic colorectal cancer surgery. *Br J Surg.* 2020 Jan;107(2):e133-e141. <u>TAP blocks during laparoscopic surgery</u> cut pain, opioid use & improved GI motility better than general anesthesia alone with shorter hospital stays than patient who got epidurals.
- Andrews-Cooper IN, Kozachik SL. How <u>patient education influences utilization of nonpharmacological modalities</u> for persistent pain management: an integrative review *Pain Manag Nurs*. 2020 Apr;21(2):157-164. Patient education about nondrug methods can motivate adults with chronic pain to use these modalities to improve outcomes. professionals should inform patients & urge them to try these methods.
- Kiang MV, Humphreys K, Cullen MR, et al. Opioid prescribing patterns among medical providers in the United States, 2003-17: retrospective, observational study. BMJ. 2020;368:l6968. Prudent opioid prescribing is demonstrated by the clear majority but the top 1% of prescribers account for 27% of opioid and 19% of benzodiazepine prescriptions. Focusing on them instead of 99% of prescribers is advised.
- Martinez-Calderon J, et al. Conservative interventions reduce <u>fear in individuals with chronic low back pain</u>: a systematic review. Arch *Phys Med Rehabil*. 2020 Feb;101(2):329-358. Exercise, CBT, manual therapy &/or electrotherapy can reduce fear and improve LBP outcomes.

- Neill LA, Kim HS, Cameron KA, et al. Who Is Keeping Their Unused Opioids and Why? Pain Med. 2020 Jan 1;21(1):84-91. A qualitative study of 100 patients who decided to keep of unused opioids a month after prescribed, revealed they did so "just in case" their pain recurred.
- Kienzl M, Storr M, Schicho R. Cannabinoids and opioids in the treatment of inflammatory bowel diseases. *Clin Transl Gastroenterol.* 2020; Jan 11(1):e00120. Anecdotal reports show <u>cannabis may have reduce pain</u>, <u>inflammation & diarrhea</u> in patients with IBD.
- Gudin J, Fudin J. Peripheral opioid receptor antagonists for opioid-induced constipation (OIC): a primer on pharmacokinetic variabilities with
 a focus on drug interactions. J. Pain Res 2020:13 447–456. Peripherally acting μ-receptor antagonists (PAMORAs) include
 methylnaltrexone, naloxegol & naldemedine. Each are approved for treating OIC & have unique pharmacokinetic properties that can interact
 with food or drugs.
- Lancaster RJ, Wren K, Hudson A, et al. Intravenous <u>lidocaine for chronic neuropathic pain</u> a systematic review addressing nursing care. *Pain Manag Nurs*. 2020 Apr;21(2):194-200. Lidocaine for pain has infrequent side effects but demand monitoring for neurological changes.
- Bailey CS, Rasoulinejad P, Taylor D, et al. <u>Surgery versus Conservative Care for Persistent Sciatica</u> Lasting 4 to 12 Months. *N Engl J Med*.
 2020 Mar 19;382(12):1093-1102. Microdiscectomy cuts pain at 6-12 months better than conservative therapy for disc-related chronic sciatica.

- Hints for people on getting through bad arthritis pain days by being proactive in using effective strategies to prevent it from getting worse.
- The National Institutes of Health Pain Consortium has a resource page that summarizes what is known about different pain conditions
- Slow-breathing combined with mindful attention to breath reduces pain but is not reversible by naloxone.
- A systematic review & meta-analysis supports the effectiveness of at least 20 minutes of music reduces pain in adults critical care patients.
- Although a burden for some, many find pets help older adults learn & use CBT coping strategies with physical, emotional & social benefits.
